Noura bint Mohammed Al Kaabi was appointed UAE Minister of Culture and Knowledge Development in October 2017. As Minister of Culture and Knowledge Development, Al Kaabi is responsible for the promotion of UAE-based cultural initiatives on both national and international level. In her capacity as Minister, she is responsible for developing policies and legislations that support cultural activities in the UAE and to nurture young creative talent within the community. Previously, she has held the post of Minister of State for Federal National Council Affairs.

In addition to her ministerial responsibilities, Al Kaabi is also President of Zayed University, Chairperson of Abu Dhabi Media Zone Authority and Abu Dhabi National Exhibition Centre. She also sits on the board of Abu Dhabi Media.

Al Kaabi is the first Emirati to be ranked in Foreign Policy magazine's 'Top 100 Global Thinkers List'. In 2014, she was named Forbes Middle East's 30 Most Influential Women in Government. Her role in growing the UAE's media industry was recognised by America Abroad Media in 2015 and she was named as one of 20 Most Powerful Women in global television by The Hollywood Reporter in 2016. She has been a Young Global Leader at the World Economic Forum since 2014.

Al Kaabi received her high school education in Abu Dhabi and Pennsylvania. She holds a Bachelor of Arts in Management Information Systems from UAE University in Al Ain, and also completed an Executive Leadership Programme at the London Business School in 2011.

"AMSI Voices" was born January 22. 2016 and we have not looked back since. in typical Al Mawakeb form. It all started when the AMSI CAO, herself an Al Mawakeb alumnus of 1984, had lunch with Hind Seddiqi' 2001. The conversation yielded the conclusion that our alumni wanted to give back and what better way to do so but through an organized effort that calls upon other alumni to volunteer the most valuable thing they can, "their time" and offer their knowledge, expertise, mentorship and support to our students in the Grades 11 & 12. They are at the critical stage in their lives where their thoughts revolve around "what's next" and our alumni wanted to share their successes, trials and tribulations.

This would prove to be an incredible journey that started at one lunch and more than 2 years later has seen over 140 alumni come back to our schools and impact the lives of our students. The AMSI Voices Steering Committee was formed and we could not wait to get started. Ms. Alissar and Hind were joined by Mania Merikhi' 2000, Mariam Al Afridi' 1999, and Mahra Al Khaja' 2005 who were as committed to the AV vision and whose backgrounds would propel the work forward. AV was founded to become a networking platform for student empowerment, and this group was firmly dedicated to making it happen.

The first AMSI Voices Conference took place on March 24, 2016 at the Roda Al Bustan Hotel; it was titled "Girls are Makers of Change". We did not know what to expect, but we did know one thing, we wanted to make a difference, this conference delivered. 24 awesome young women, all Al Mawakeb alumni, lead by a stunning keynote speech by HE Reem Al Hashimi' 1995, spent a whole day speaking with 350 girls from Grades 11 & 12, in panel discussions and a workshop that left everyone inspired; everyone including the alumni. The event was beyond success expectations and the

momentum from the conference continued for months. The following October 2016, it was time for the 2nd conference for the boys of G11 & 12. The Steering Committee had now evolved from 5 ladies, and we were joined by 4 gentlemen, Dino Drimakis' 2005, Tarek Berri' 2002, Firas Al Bannani' 1999 and Mohammad Al Harmi' 2001 who also believed in our vision "to give back, inspire, make a difference and touch the lives of our students". Our keynote speaker this time was the CEO of DIFC, Mr. Arif Amiri' 1993 and another 24 alumni came on that day to share their stories and impart their







knowledge. We saw a similar ripple effect of inspiration and motivation that overcame the day and kept going for months after.

The latest AMSI Voices Conference was in October 2017 and "what's next" was the theme. This time we brought the girls and boys of G12 together and we mixed our panels to include an awesome group of 28 alumni ladies and gentlemen who will yet again continue to inspire and model the dreams and aspirations of our seniors. We were once again honored to have HE Reem Al Hashimi ' 1995 be our keynote speaker and her memorable words impacted us all. In addition to the 3 conferences to date, our AV SC have also launched the "Monday 101's" program which every campus benefits from. One Monday every year, a group of 7-10 alumni visit every campus and run workshops for seniors. The objective is to teach a specific skill and the seniors rotate between 3-4 workshops that are of interest to them. Topics range from "managing your finances' To "writing an effective CV" to "autocad basics" to "Yoga for beginners" to "how to handle setbacks" and many more. AV also has a "Who Are They: A glimpse into our AMSI Voices journey" event where all the AMSI Voices conference speakers in addition to a few other alumni are invited back to campus to share their stories with the seniors in a more intimate setting.

AMSI Voices have embarked on an incredible journey and the future looks bright ahead. We look forward to many more events to come and we remain committed to our vision. What made this initiative easy for us to undertake was the sense of family we always felt at our schools. We always knew our relationship with our school will not end after graduation and it is our time to give back to our family.
